We were all impressed and grateful for the Chief's time.



## Self Defense for Women

Are you a woman who wants to learn physical self-defense and risk avoidance skills?

Tallahassee Police Department offers a free 12-hour course several times a year called the R.A.D. System or Rape Aggression Defense System. Classes are open to women ages 12 and older and are completed over the course of two back-to-back Saturdays.

The R.A.D. System is a program of realistic self-defense tactics and techniques for women. The R.A.D. System is a comprehensive, women-only course that begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction and risk avoidance, while progressing on to the basics of hands-on defense training. R.A.D. is not a Martial Arts program. Courses are taught by nationally certified R.A.D. Instructors and provide each student with a workbook/reference manual that outlines the entire



Physical Defense Program for reference and continuous personal growth.

The R.A.D class is offered at no charge by the Tallahassee Police Crime Prevention Unit. While the simulations are voluntary, students must commit to attending both scheduled classes. Each

class is limited to 20 students. Classes are held at the Lincoln Neighborhood Center, 438 West Brevard Street Tallahassee, FL 32301.

## Walking My Dog in the Hood By Judith Rainbrook

HI, everyone! I am Judith Rainbrook, and I am owned by the world's cutest dog, Scruffy. He is a terrier mix, all 18 pounds of him, and he is a "rescue dog" brought home from an RV park in Arkansas. Scruffy settled in as my physical fitness coach, and so, we walk the Hood.

Because my schedule is "flexible," we walk at all times of the day and night. We get the early morning mists; pale pink skies working up to blue; clear night skies full of sparkling stars; sunsets over the trees; and light rain and heavy downpours that fill all the ditches with swift water. We have seen owls sitting in the street in the early evening and a pair of red-shouldered hawks sitting in the bright, noon sun on the fence around the baseball field in Optimist Park.

We get to hear and see birds of all kinds, some we know and others remain a mystery. Frequently, we see Pileated Woodpeckers knocking great chunks of wood from dying trees. Cardinals are always there, and the Carolina wren can be seen and heard on every block. Squirrels rustle unseen through the undergrowth and sit overhead scolding us and the neighborhood cats. This week we saw our first digger bee mound, which we just learned about from a neighbor's post on the Nene Facebook page.

Summer is definitely here when cars are parked in the driveway and washed and polished. August is here when no one in their right mind is out in the heat and humidity except the dog walkers. Ditto for winter with 20 degree mornings where two layers of clothing are required to stay warm enough to make it around the block.

Every other Thursday is always interesting -- trash day! We have been known to reclaim items put out by oth-

ers but for which we have a good and true need at our house, including scrap lumber, a small wicker trash can and a small desk.

We see DOGs -- lots of them; little and big; some under excellent verbal control by their owners and some barely under control at all; dogs that are friendly and dogs that are standoffish; dogs that growl and dogs that

wag; ancient dogs being walked with great love by their owners and fresh new puppies being dragged by new owners as they try to see everything!



I am 68 and she is ... older. She is my inspiration.

Last but not least, Scruffy and I greatly enjoy the fact that everyone who passes us waves and everyone we pass on the street says hello. Some people even stop and say "You have the world's cutest dog!"


### Nene Time Warp
















### First Annual Nene Fest 5K & Fun Run
