GOING ON VACATION? PROTECT YOUR HOME AGAINST THEFT!

On Thursday evening, June 23, 1983 the Tallahassee Police Department will conduct a brief program on how to crime proof your home during your summer vacation. The program will start promptly at 7:30 P.M. in the Education Building of the Parkway Baptist Church on East Indianhead Drive. The program is designed to last approximately 30 minutes so do try to arrive no later than 7:30.

Portable engravers for marking valuables will be available to neighbors on a first-come, first-serve basis. (NOTE: The Police Department is forbidden by law to return stolen merchandise to an owner unless positive identification such as an engraved code, can be made by the owner).

Following this short session, the Police Department will address the growing problem of child molesting in our community and how parents can protect their children.

Don't miss this valuable opportunity to learn how to protect your children and property. One hour of your time on June 23 may save you hours of grief this summer.

WATCH FOR "CRIME WATCH" SIGNS!

We have finally earned our Neighborhood Crime Watch Signs as a result of our crime watch program. The poles for signs are in place. As soon as the new signs are printed, the Tallahassee Police Department will put them up.

NEIGHBORHOOD GARDEN CONTEST

In appreciation of the many beautiful yards and gardens in our neighborhood, your Board of Trustees has decided to sponsor a contest this summer to recognize two of the most outstanding examples. To this end, twenty dollar gift certificates from Native Nurseries on Centerville Road will be awarded in each of two categories: "Most Attractive Frontyard" and "Most Attractive Backyard".

The judging will be on Saturday morning, June 25, 1983 with winners to be notified that afternoon. Two officials from the Tallahassee Garden Club along with one representative from our neighborhood association will judge each entry according to each yard's overall design and maintenance. Extra consideration will be given to special features such as vegetable gardens, sensitively preserved native vegetation, and outstanding flower beds.

To have a yard considered for this contest, you can nominate yourself or a neighbor. (All neighbors not nominating themselves will be contacted by phone in advance to ensure that they will be home on the morning of the contest, and that they are willing to participate.) There is no limit as to how many different yards each person can nominate. The yards must be in Indian Head or LeHigh Acres, although the nominees need not be members of the association. # DISTRICT MAP

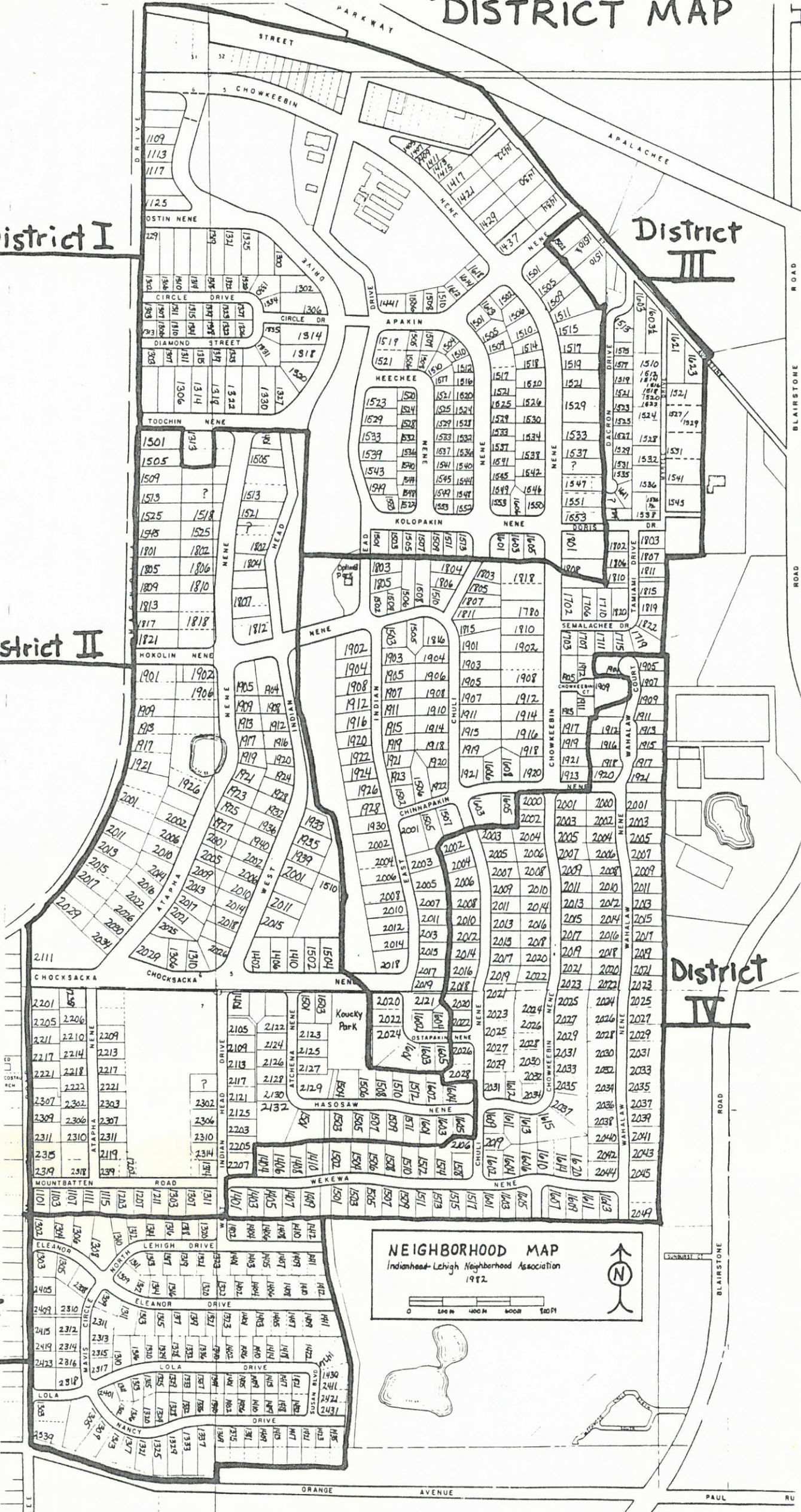

### SPRUCE PINE FOREST DEVELOPMENT - UPDATE

As many of you know from the zoning battle of 1981, the 50 acres adjoining Indian Head and LeHigh has been zoned as a Planned Unit Development. The property has recently been acquired by Mad Dog Construction Company. Happily for us, in their final development plan, Mad Dog will reduce the maximum density from 250 units to 160 units and will build mostly single family homes and some townhomes. They are also seeking the approval of the City to make minor changes in the common open space arrangement. These changes will not affect the amount of open space or the buffer area between the development and our neighborhood.

Representatives of the Neighborhood Association have met with Chuck Mitchell of Mad Dog and have attended the recent planning commission hearings. We will continue to monitor the project.
