OLD ST AUGUSTINE ROAD - REZONING

On January 5, 1984, the Tallahassee Leon County Planning Commission met to consider a request to rezone 1.96 acres on Old St. Augustine Road off Apakin Nene from single family (R-1) to medium residential (RM-1). The property consists of 3 lots owned by Dorothy Wilson, Grace Carter and Wesley Carter and if rezoned would be developed into apartments or town houses. At the hearing, nearby residents objected to the proposal because of drainage problems, traffic congestion and lowering of property values. There was also concern over the future of the Canopy Road.

The Neighborhood Association has passed a resolution opposing the rezoning and a written resolution will be prepared for presentation to the Planning Commission on February 8, 1984 and to the City Commission, which will make a final decision at their meeting on Tuesday, March 13, 1984 at 7:00 PM, at City Hall.
