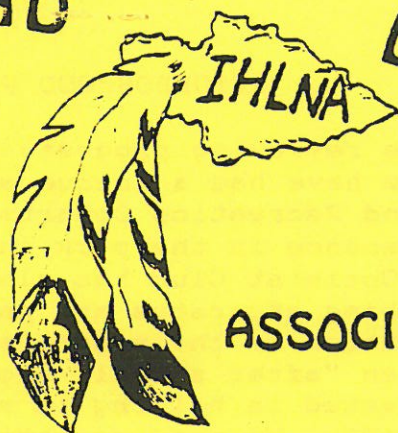

GARBAGE, TRASH AND RECYCLING



It is not clear yet what the City's final policy on trash and garbage pickup will be, but you can be sure they will be looking for ways to cut the current \$15/month home cost.

There is still hope for a leaf vacuuming system so we can stop putting all those plastic bags in the landfill. Call your city commissioners (599-8181) if you'd like to see this.

You can help reduce the volume of material to be transported and landfilled by composting and mulching with pine needles and leaves, taking newspapers to the recycling box at the back of Hartsfield School (E. Indianhead entrance), taking clean glass to the bins at the Leon County Food Coop on Gaines Street, selling aluminum cans (look in the Yellow Pages under recycling) and saving used "treasures" for the neighborhood Flea Market in the spring!

Please, keep trash out of the drainage swales. Not only does it contribute to flooding problems during heavy rain, but organic material washed into the creek creates pollution.



NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS



The Board will be reviewing progress improvements at Optimist Park. For several years we have had a unique arrangement with the Tallahassee Parks and Recreation Department involving neighborhood assistance in maintenance in the park in exchange for city improvements. The Optimist Club has also donated funds that purchased the new wooden climbing apparatus and part of the wooden pole fence. We anticipate renovation of the restrooms in the Scout House. There is presently an "after school" program there.

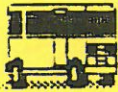

TALTRAN ROUTE IN DANGER



One bus route comes into Indianhead in the morning & afternoon, and it's likely to be deleted due to poor ridership. Some people use this bus to go to work downtown. The route runs east from Magnolia along Circle and Apakin Nene to Chuli Nene (south) to Wekewa Nene (west) to West Indianhead (north) to Chocksaka Nene (west) to Atapha Nene (north) to Hokolin nene. Busses run about 7:20 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. weekdays. Regular fare is fifty cents a trip, exact fare. Special discounts are available for senior citizens and youth. Call 576-5134 for additional information. If you would use the bus if more service was available, please call one of the Board members and let us know. We need some idea as to how important this issue is to the neighborhood.



COUNCIL OF NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATIONS



C.O.N.A. has selected the local comprehensive plan, stormwater management and traffic and road construction as the top priority areas for 1986-87. Indianhead/Lehigh Neighborhood Association has been active in C.O.N.A. and encourages all neighbors to attend delegate assembly meetings and participate in committees if they can. Meetings are at City Hall, and begin at 7:30 p.m.

Committees are: Local Comprehensive Plan, Transportation, Community Service/Criminal Justice, Government Affairs (monitors govt. meetings including zoning), and Better Neighborhoods (assists in organization of new & existing neighborhood associations).
