This has been a quiet but productive year for our neighborhood. With an absence of zoning or crime problems to deal with, we have turned our efforts inward to strengthen the concept of "neighboring." Maximum effort has been put toward capitalizing on city and Optimist Club monies donated to our park and Scouthouse. Dale Allen has spent much time organizing plantings, coordinating new tot-lot equipment and overseeing painting of current equipment and the Scout House. His efforts as your neighbor directly impact on each of us each time we use the park. We have reached out to the Council of Neighborhood Associations, an important organization we belong to that oversees neighborhood interests, by donating money to help them represent our interests. Our delegate to that body, Roxanne Dow, has spent many hours in meetings discussing improvements to the Comprehensive Plan and Transportation plans which so affect our lives. Our board is planning an elaborate Spring Festival and the upcoming Flea market so we can each benefit from living in this neighborhood -- a place where we can do fun, things together and experience what a true neighborhood of caring people is. Je have fought for continued bus service to our neighborhood and won, at least for this year. #### IT'S MEMBERSHIP TIME

Annual membership dues are \$5.00 per voting member (this covers the entire household if you want only one vote). Dues are payable at the beginning of the second quarter of the year (to coincide with the annual springtime events) and must be paid before you can vote at the annual spring election. (1986 dues should be paid now.)

The dues are used to support the Association activities (see the list below). The newsletter is only mailed to members except for the spring issue which is sent neighborhood-wide.
