NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME -- Just the Facts

Neighborhood concerns about crime are heightened by a lack of information. What types of crime are prevalent in our neighborhood and how frequently are they occurring? The IHLNA tries to stay on top of problems and we have contacted the Tallahassee Police Department to obtain information on reported crime in our neighborhood.

The following information is a summary of crimes in the Indianhead and Lehigh neighborhoods that were reported to the Police Department during 1990. The report covers crimes which appear to be of most concern to residents, such as burglary, robbery, auto theft, and drug possession. The Police report did not include information on aggravated battery and criminal mischief.

Most home burglaries are committed by youthful amateurs who are able to gain easy access to your home. You can take simple precautions to help prevent these types of crimes: keep exterior doors locked at all times, keep an eye on your neighbors homes, and report suspicious persons or activities to the police immediately.

Finally, remember to report all crimes, no matter how minor they may seem, to the Tallahassee Police Department. That is the only way the we can get an accurate picture of crimes that affect our neighborhood. A police officer will be at the Sprint Festival to provide information on home security and other crime prevention measures.
