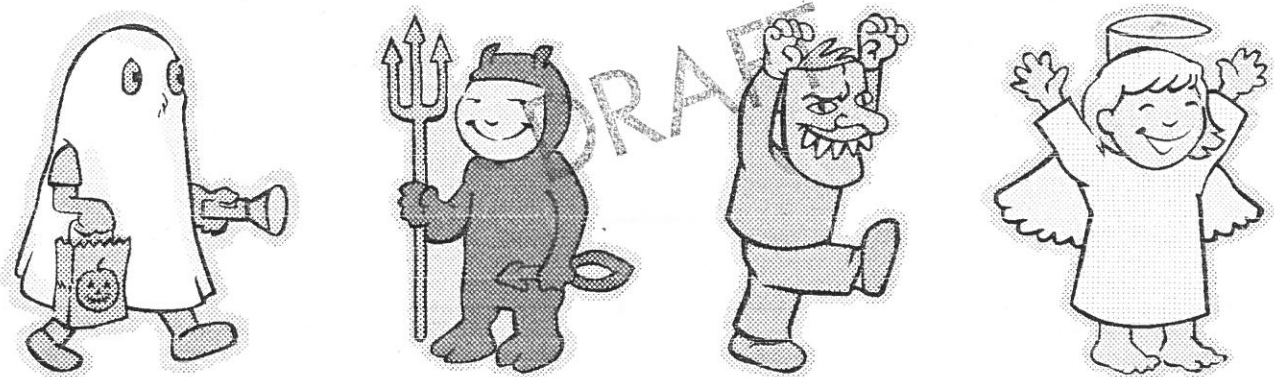


## *Halloween Party*

The current design for widening Orange Avenue on the south side of the neighborhood is for a four-laned road with a median. A traffic circle is proposed at the intersection with Jim Lee Road. To provide a sound and visual barrier between the increased traffic on the road and the neighborhood, a hedge planting of wax myrtle is planned.
