


Polling Place

Orange Avenue Update

We've all been aware of the plans to widen



Orange Avenue for a while. One of the details that can affect this neighborhood is the location of the utility poles in the road right-of-way. Grant Gelhardt will be sending a letter to the

City and County commissioners to request that when Orange Avenue is widened that all of the utility poles be placed on the south side of the road. Neighborhood Projects Update

Thanks to the friends of Optimist Park and the greenway who volunteered their Saturday mornings last fall to help on out on three important projects.

First, a combination of herbicides, tools, and hard labor resulted in removal or killing of a number of invasive exotic plants in the greenway. There is still a lot more work to do, so feel free to contribute to this on-going project whenever you can.

Secondly, we did some maintenance work and clearing on the greenway trail north of Hokolin. The city also replaced the stairs just north of Holokin, so the trail is quite accessible now. And last, but not least, the playground equipment at Optimist

Park got a muchneeded scrubbing. It looks great now!

Spring cleaning? Yard projects?

As you take on your spring projects, here are a few tips on properly discarding the resultant debris:

- First, recycle as much as possible!
- Be sure to separate yard trash (limbs, weeds) from appliances and other white goods at the curbside.
- Don't place any type of trash in the bottom of the swale or ditch; this can lead to clogged pipes and possible flooding.
