**3. Updates and neighbor concerns:** Betsy shared that Neighbor to Neighbor in the Nenes (N3), thanks to a grant and generous neighborhood support, has hired its first professional Executive Director. Her name is Carrie Gaudio and Betsy relayed that Carrie is a Florida State University alum who worked for many years at the Agency for Health Care Administration as the Policy Coordinator for Health Information Technology overseeing statewide initiatives. Marie-Claire shared that Hartsfield Elementary will be starting an International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) and the new director of that program, Fayon Jones, would like to come to a future meeting to update the Board on this fantastic opportunity for our neighborhood school and its students.
